Autumn's paradoxes of harvest and decay, of dying and seeding, offer powerful metaphors by which we can frame the important cycles and questions in our own lives.

Through the lens of autumn, this one-day retreat offers you time away from busy lives to reflect on your life and work, the gifts that you bring, and the things that call to you and matter most at this time.

We will draw on poems, stories, images, and other evocative things to inspire times of personal reflection and shared conversations.

Going on retreat:


